## CLASSICAL INSTRUMENTS PLUS QCARD"

The Classical Instruments Plus QCard contains 8 megabytes of new, high quality, 16 bit samples along with a bank of Programs that utilize them.

# Software Requirements:

This card will perform without incident in any revision of QS6", QS7" and QS8" as well as in the QuadraSynth® Plus Piano and S4" Plus Sound Module.

We recommend that your QuadraSynth or S4 QuadraSynth Sound Module run with software version 1.07 or later in order to fully realize the power of the Programs on your QCard. Earlier software versions may play the Programs differently than they were intended. If your unit has older software, please contact an authorized Alesis Service Center for a current software update. To display the software version of your unit, hold GLOBAL and press PROGRAM.

## Auditioning the New Programs with QuadraSynth / S4 1.07 software:

To hear the new ROM CARD Programs on a QuadraSynth or S4 with 1.07 software, you must first load them into the USER bank. This action, however, will erase the current contents of the USER bank.

IMPORTANT: Loading the bank from this card will erase the current USER bank in your QuadraSynth. For this reason, you should back up your current USER bank by saving it to a storage device (i.e., to a RAM card, or via SysEx dump to a MIDI librarian or sequencer) before loading the bank from the ROM CARD.

### To load the ROM CARD bank into the QuadraSynth or S4:

CAUTION: This will overwrite all Programs, Mixes and Effects in your current USER bank.

- 1. Make sure the label side of the ROM CARD is facing up, then insert it firmly into the Sound Card slot until you feel it seat itself firmly inside the port.
- 2. Press [STORE] once.
- 3. Use [<PAGE] or [PAGE>] to select Page 7 (the Page number will be underlined in the lower left side of the display). The upper right portion of the display will read:

#### LOAD FROM CARD 1?

4. Press [STORE] a second time to load the card bank. The display will read:

#### LOADING FROM CARD...

You have now loaded the ROM CARD bank into your USER bank. Note that the Program or Mix you selected before the load operation is still playable as the edit buffers are unaffected by a ROM CARD load. To play the new bank, you must recall a different USER Program or Mix.

NOTE: For additional information on banks and storage conventions of the QuadraSynth, please consult your QuadraSynth Reference Manual.

### Auditioning the New Programs in a QuadraSynth Plus Piano, S4 Plus Sound Module, QS6, QS7, or QS8:

The QuadraSynth Plus Piano and S4 Plus Sound Module can play Program and Mix data directly from the ROM CARD — you do not need to overwrite your USER bank in order to access your new ROM CARD Programs and Mixes.

To access ROM CARD Programs and Mixes, press [<BANK] or [BANK>] until the display reads "Crd1:" to the left of the Program or Mix name. You can then scroll through the ROM CARD Programs and Mixes in the same manner as you would with the PRESET or USER banks.

## Using New Sounds:

With the ROM CARD inserted into the synth, any Alesis synthesizer Program can access the new card sounds. These new sounds are added to the list of sounds when accessing the VOICE function of Program Edit mode.

NOTE: These sounds reside on the ROM CARD itself and are not loaded into the synth. This means that the ROM CARD must be inserted correctly in order to hear a Program with its intended ROM CARD sounds. If you recall such a Program and the ROM CARD is not inserted, nothing will be heard for voices assigned to a ROM CARD sound. On the other hand, if you insert a different ROM CARD and recall such a Program, those voices will use the sounds in the same location as the original ROM CARD's sounds.

## To Assign a Program's Voice to a ROM CARD Sound on a QuadraSynth, S4, QuadraSynth Plus Piano or S4 Plus;

- Press [PROGRAM] to put the QuadraSynth in Program mode, and select the Program to which
  you wish to assign a ROM CARD sound.
- Press [SELECT] to enter Program Edit mode. The display's edit status line will read: "EDITING: PROGRAM".
- Press [EDIT 1] to choose which of the four voices you wish to assign; the currently selected voice number (1-4) will appear to the right of the words "EDITING: PROGRAM".
- 4. Press [ASSIGN] to jump to the ASSIGN VOICE page.
- 5. Turn Quad Knob [1] to scroll past the internal Sound Groups to the ROM CARD's Sound Group. The upper display will show "Z8Kybd:" to indicate the group of sounds that reside on the ROM CARD.

NOTE: If the ROM CARD is inserted improperly, you will not be able to access the new Sound Group,

6. Turn Quad Knob [3] to select a ROM CARD sound. The name of the selected sound will appear to the right of the Sound Group name: Z8Kybd: ConcrtGrnd Use the [VALUE] buttons to select different card voices.

### To Assign a Program's Voice to a ROM CARD Sound on a QS6, QS7 or QS8:

- Press [PROGRAM] to put the synth in Program mode, and select the Program to which you wish to assign a ROM CARD sound.
- Press [EDIT SELECT] to enter Program Edit mode, and then press [VOICE] (also labeled "40 BASS" on the button itself) to edit the Sounds used in the Program.
- 3. Press [SOUND 1], [SOUND 2], [SOUND 3] or [SOUND 4] (also labeled "00 PIANO", "01 CHROMATIC", "02 ORGAN" and "03 GUITAR" respectively) to choose which of the four voices you wish to assign. NOTE: if the word "sound" is in lower case then this voice is not currently being used in the Program.
- Press [PAGE>] twice to jump to the SOUND GROUP SELECT page.
- 5. Move the data entry slider to scroll past the internal Sound Groups to the ROM CARD's Sound Group. The display will show "Z8Kybd." to indicate the first Sound Group that resides on the ROM CARD.

NOTE: If the ROM CARD is inserted improperly, you will not be able to access the new Sound Group.

 Press [PAGE>] once more to select the individual Sound within the Sound Group. The display will read: SOUND: ConcrtGrnd Use the [VALUE] buttons to select different card voices.

#### Handling and Precautions:

- · Keep the ROM CARD away from direct sunlight and moisture.
- Never poke anything into the pin slots of the ROM CARD.
- · Keep the ROM CARD edge free from contaminants which can jam into the receiving pins and prevent good contact.
- Do not force the ROM CARD into the Sound Card slot be sure it is aligned properly before pushing it in.
- Keep the ROM CARD in its protective case when not in use.
