# Attaching the Pocketrak soft case to a tripod

Screw the tripod attachment into the threaded socket on the Pocketrack soft case.



### Note:

- · No tripod is included. It is an optional accessory.
- The diameter of the mounting hole is 1/4 inch (6.35mm).
- Using the included microphone stand adapter, you can attach the soft case to a microphone stand (the diameter of adapter thread is 3/8 inches, or 9.525mm).

# About the Battery

If the battery becomes exhausted during deletion, it will be impossible to delete the recorded material.

# CAUTION: for encloop (Rechargeable Ni-MH Battery)

### Charge before use

If the encloop battery becomes exhausted, you must charge it before use. The battery may become warm during charging, but this is not a malfunction

Do not recharge conventional (alkaline) batteries.

When charging the battery outside this product, use a charger that supports eneloop batteries, and observe the instructions given in the "owner's manual" for your charger.

# If the battery fluid leaks

If the battery does leak, avoid contact with the leaked fluid. If the battery fluid should come in contact with your eyes, mouth, skin, or clothes, wash immediately with water and consult a doctor. 





# Adjusting the direction of the built-in microphones (Tilt up)




You can adjust the direction of the built-in microphones. For example, if you place the unit on a table to record, you can tilt the mic up to avoid noise from the table top. Adjust the direction of the mic to suit the recording circumstances.

### Note:

 Do not adjust the microphone angle during recording. Otherwise, undesirable handling noise will be recorded

# Inserting a battery

Turn the power off before you replace the batterv.



### Note: \_\_\_\_

· If you use an alkaline battery, press and hold down the MENU/STOP button for at least two seconds to access the COMMON menu, then select "ALKA-LINE" for the BATTERY SETTING.

# **Battery indicator**

Check the battery indicator on the LCD screen to determine the remaining battery power.

- : Good condition
- Weak battery
  - Exhausted battery: Recharge the "eneloop" (page 35) or replace the battery with a new alkaline battery. If you keep using the recorder without recharging the "eneloop" or replacing the battery, the recorder will display the message "LOW BATTERY PLEASE CHARGE A BATTERY" or "LOW BATTERY." The LCD screen will then go dark.

# <sup>™</sup>Hint∙

For more information on recharging the "eneloop" battery, refer to page 35. When you turn on the power to the recorder for the

first time after purchase, set the date and time. To do so, press and hold down the MENU/STOP button for at least two seconds to access the COMMON menu, then use the DATE & TIME settings.

### Note:

· Dispose of all used batteries safely in accordance with all applicable laws.

# **Basic Operations**

# Selecting a menu item



Press and hold down the MENU/ STOP button for at least two seconds

Press the ►► or ◄ button: Moves the cursor highlight up/down.

**Press the** ▶ **button:** Selects the menu item.

Canceling the operation or return to the previous display.

**Press the MENU/STOP button:** Returns to the previous display.

# Using the headphones

Connect the headphones to the  $\bigcap$  socket. The speaker will be disconnected automatically.

# Using an external stereo microphone

Connect an external stereo microphone (not supplied) to the ightharpoonup socket.

The built-in microphones will be disconnected automatically.

### Note:

 If you use an external stereo microphone, press and hold down the MENU/STOP button for at least two seconds to access the VOICE menu, then select "MIC" for the REC SELECT.

# Turning the power on or off



Set the POWER/HOLD switch to the right.

"HELLO!" appears briefly on the display and the power turns on, and

then the last selected file number appears (Resume function).



**Set the POWER/HOLD switch to the left.** "SEE YOU!" appears on the display and the power turns off.

# Auto power off function

- If you leave the unit turned on for 15 minutes without using it, the unit will automatically turn off.
- If you leave the unit turned on with a recording paused for more than 15 minutes, the unit will turn off the power after it creates the recorded file.

# **Hold function**

The Hold function can help you to avoid stopping operation (playback or recording) by accidentally pressing a button.



Set the POWER/HOLD switch to the left while the unit is operating. The Hold function is engaged.

 If an operation button is pressed while the Hold function is engaged, "HOLD ON" will appear on the display and nothing else will happen.



Set the POWER/HOLD switch to the right. "HOLD OFF" appears on the display and the Hold function is disengaged.

 If operation (playback or recording) is finished while the Hold function is engaged, the unit automatically shuts down.

# Adjusting the volume



Press the VOL + or – button. The volume level appears on the display (VOLUME 0 to VOLUME 20).

# **Quick Guide**

# Recording

Do not remove the battery during recording.

You can adjust the direction of the built-in microphones to suit your recording situation (page 13).

1. Press the FOLDER/INDEX button to select a folder (A. B. C. D or S).





### Note:

- · Press and hold down the FOI DER/INDEX button for at least two seconds to select the S folder
- · Do not select the L or M folder. The L and M folders are not VOICE folders. If you select one of them. built-in microphone recordings will be recorded automatically to the A folder, However, if the A folder is full, no additional built-in microphone recordings are possible (until you delete some recordings).
- · The unit can record up to 99 files in any one folder (A, B, C, D or S). "FILE FULL" appears if you attempt to record a 100th file in any folder.


# ŸHint:

### 2. Press the PAUSE/REC button.



The recording LED lights up and recording starts.



### Note:

 With some files, the elapsed recording time displayed on the LCD may differ from the actual elapsed time.

# Stopping recording

Press the MENU/STOP button.



# **Pausing recording**

**Press the PAUSE/REC button.**Press it again to resume recording.



# **Inserting index marks**

You can insert index marks only in the files in the VOICE folder.

To insert an index mark, press the FOLDER/INDEX button during recording.

"INDEX SETTING 1/32" appears briefly and recording continues.

### Note:


 You can insert up to 32 index marks in each file. If you try to enter additional index marks, "INDEX FULL" appears briefly on the display. You can delete all index marks as a group, but you cannot delete individual index marks.

# **Playback**

- Press the FOLDER/INDEX button to select a folder (A, B, C, D, L or M).
- 2. Press the ► or ► button to select a file.



**3. Press the ► button**. Playback begins.



# **Stopping playback**

Press the MENU/STOP button.

Press the ► button to resume playback.



### Note:

- · A few seconds may be required to start playback of a file or an extremely large number of files.
- Depending on the MP3/WMA file, the displayed playing time may vary from the actual playing time.
- You may be unable to play certain MP3/WMA files on this unit.

# **Changing playback speed**



Use the Playback speed control switch to change the playback speed.



- SLOW (Slow speed playback)
- NORMAL (Normal speed playback)
- FAST (Fast speed playback)

### Note:

· This function may not work with some files.

# **Deleting**



The deleted file is not recoverable.

# Deleting the selected file

- Press the FOLDER/INDEX button to select a folder.
- 2. Press the DEL button






- Press the ►► or ◄◄ button to select "FILE". then press the ▶ button.
- 4. Press the ► or ◄ button to select the file to be deleted. then press the ▶ button.



Press the ►► or ◄◄ button to. select "YES", then press the ▶ button



The selected file is deleted.






· After you delete a file, the subsequent files will be renumbered automatically. (For example, if you delete File 2 from a set of Files 1, 2, and 3, then File 3 will be renumbered as File 2.)

# Deleting all files in the selected folder

- 1. Press the DFL button
- 2. Press the ►► or ◄◄ button to select "FOLDER", then press the ▶ button.
- 3. Press the ►► or ►< button to select the folder to be deleted, then press the ▶ button.

# Connecting the unit to your computer

You can connect the USB terminal on the recorder directly to a USB connector on your computer. Open the USB terminal cover on the recorder, use the USB terminal slide switch to extend the USB terminal, then insert the extended USB terminal in the correct orientation into a USB connector on your computer.

Do not apply force to the terminal. Otherwise, it may break. If necessary, use the supplied USB cable.



Take note of the orientation of the terminal.

# Precautions when using the USB terminal

When connecting the USB terminal to the computer, make sure to observe the following points. Failing to do so risks freezing the computer and corrupting or losing the data. If the computer or the unit freezes, restart the application software or Windows OS, or turn the power to the unit off then on again.

# **A** CAUTION

- Before connecting the USB terminal to the computer, exit from any power-saving mode of the computer (such as suspended, sleep, standby).
- Execute the following before turning the power to the unit on/off or plugging/unplugging the USB terminal.
  - Make sure that no read or write operations are in progress.
  - Safely remove the unit from the Windows taskbar after closing all windows that accessed the unit.

 While the unit is connected to the computer, you should wait for six seconds or more between these operations: (1) when turning the power of the unit off then on again, or (2) when alternately plugging/unplugging the USB terminal.

### Note:

- When you connect the recorder to the computer for the first time, some computers may not immediately recognize the unit as a Removable Disk. In this case, disconnect the unit and reconnect it again.
- While the unit is connected to the computer, the unit will operate without consuming battery power.

# Disconnecting the unit from your computer



Before disconnecting the unit from your computer, make sure that no data is being transferred.

Follow the steps below to disconnect. (The screen shots are of Windows XP.)

- The screen might look different if you are using a different OS.
- Right-click the device icon on the taskbar at the bottom right of the Windows screen to pop up the menu option [Safely Remove Hardware].

If the icon is not displayed, refer to Windows Help.


2. Click [Safely Remove Hardware].



- Select [USB Mass Storage Device] and click [Stop].
- Make sure that [Yamaha Pocketrak USB Device] is in the list, then select [USB Mass Storage Device] and click [OK].
- 5. Disconnect the unit from your computer.

# About the folder in Removable Disk

When you connect the recorder to your computer, Removable Disk icons will appear in the My Computer directory folder in Windows.



# [VOICE] and [VOICE\_S] folders

These folders store files recorded by the unit. The [VOICE] folder contains sub-folders A-D (VOICE).

- Files recorded and stored in the A folder inside the VOICE folder are named "IC\_A\_XXX (file number).MP3" or "IC\_A\_XXX (file number).WAV".
- The same naming rule applies to the B, C, and D folders.
- Each of the A, B, C, D, and S folders accommodates up to 99 files.
- You can play back only the files (in the VOICE folder) that comply with the file naming rules for folders A through D.

For example, if you move file IC\_B\_001.MP3 from the B folder to the A folder, you will be unable to play the file. Also, keep in mind that if you change the name of a file, you will be unable to play the file on the unit.

# [MUSIC] folder

This folder stores files transferred from your computer.

- There are no naming rules applied to files that are transferred from a computer. However, the files must be in MP3 or WMA format.
- The playback sequence may change if you add files to the MUSIC folder, or if you create a subfolder inside the MUSIC folder.
- You can create sub-folders inside the MUSIC folder and move files to those sub-folders.

# [DATA] and [DATA\_S] folders

These folders store data files (Excel, Word, etc.) as a Removable Disk.

The system displays the DATA\_S folder if the security lock has been canceled.

# [Manual] folder

This folder stores the PDF manual files in each of the language folders (English/German/French/Spanish/Italian).

- Each of the language folders contains the owner's manual (supplied) and the reference manual (PDF only).
- In order to view the PDF files, Adobe Reader must be installed in your computer. (page 6)

 If you format the unit, the Manual folder will be deleted. You can download the latest PDF manual files from the following Yamaha web site. http://www.yamaha.co.jp/manual/

# [ALARM] folder

This folder stores MP3/WMA files (excluding DRM contents) that can be played as an alarm.

- If the ALARM folder is empty, a beep will be used as the alarm.
- Only one file can be used as an alarm at a time.

# [LINE] folder

This folder stores files recorded from external devices.

- Files recorded and stored in the LINE folder are named "IC\_L\_XXX (file number).MP3".
- The LINE folder accommodates up to 199 files.
- You can play only those files (in the LINE folder) that comply with the file naming rules.

# **About Cubase AI 4**

The included DVD-ROM contains Cubase AI 4 DAW software that enables you to record, edit and mix audio data.

This section explains how to install Cubase AI 4 and import audio data for editing and mixing.

While going through this section you might find it useful to also refer to the PDF manual supplied with the Cubase AI 4 software.

# Step3. Importing audio data to Cubase AI 4

1. Launch Cubase Al 4.

Click [Start]  $\rightarrow$  [All Program]  $\rightarrow$  [Steinberg Cubase Al 4]  $\rightarrow$  [Cubase Al 4] to launch the program.

· If the "ASIO Multimedia" dialog window appears, click [Yes].

Select [New Project] from the [File] menu to create a new project file.

The new project dialog window will open. For this example select [CAI4 - 4 Stereo 8 Mono Audio Track Recorder] and click [OK].



· Cubase AI 4 data is stored as a "project file".

When the directory selection dialog window appears, select the folder to which the project and audio files for the project are to be stored, and click [OK].

An empty project window with 4 stereo and 8 monaural tracks will appear.



Transport panel


 Click in the track list (the area in which the track names are displayed) to select a track to import audio data to.

The various settings for the selected track are available in the Inspector on the left side of the display.




# Go to [File] menu → [Import] → [Audio File] → [My Computer].

 The screen shots are of Windows XP. The screen might look different if you are using a different OS. Select an audio file to import from the fwolder, then click [Open].

 If the "Import Options" dialog box appears, select desired options, then click [OK]. To save the project file, select [Save] from the [File] menu, then enter a file name before actually saving the file.

Save your project file frequently to avoid losing a large amount of unsaved data in case a problem occurs.

- Be sure to insert and recharge the eneloop. Do not attempt to recharge alkaline batteries. Otherwise, the battery liquid may leak and damage the unit.
- Recharge the eneloop at an ambient temperature between 5 and 35 degrees Celsius (41 and 95 degrees Fahrenheit).

# Before recharging the eneloop


 Make sure that the BATTERY SETTING is set to "eneloop."

- To set to "eneloop", press and hold down the MENU/STOP button for at least two seconds to access the COMMON menu, then select "eneloop" for the BATTERY SETTING.
- Be sure to close the battery cover before you start recharging.

The recording LED lights up and recharging starts. When the battery is recharging, the battery indicator on the LCD screen changes in the following sequence:



When recharging is complete, the recording LED turns off.

### Note: \_\_

- · Recharging takes approximately 90 minutes.
- The recharging time is an approximate value based on a full recharge of a fully drained eneloop battery.
   The recharging time will vary depending on the power left in the battery and the ambient temperature.
- You can recharge the eneloop during data transfer.
   However, depending on how you use the unit, the battery may be exhausted more quickly.



- The battery may become warm during recharge, but this is normal.
- The battery life has come to an end if the battery is exhausted relatively quickly even after being fully recharged.

The recharging operation may not start for one of the following reasons. In such cases, a crossed-out battery icon will appear.

- A non-eneloop battery has been loaded.
- There is no battery in the unit.
- The unit is overheated.
