





RXT06 RECEIVER OPERATION




- 1. Channel Select** - Rotate the knob to select a receiver channel. For the system to operate both RXT06 and transmitter (THH06 or TBP06) must be set to the same channel.
- 2. Battery Level Indicators**
 - 3 Green = Full charge
 - 2 Green = Excellent charge
 - 1 Green = OK charge
 - 1 Red = Low charge
 - Flashing Red = Very low charge
- 3. Transmitter Signal Level Indicators**
 - 3 Green = Data excellent
 - 2 Green = Data OK, may have some interference
 - 1 Green = Data minimal, may have significant interference
 - No LED = No data, no interference
 - 1 Red = No data, some interference
 - 2 Red = No data, more interference
 - 3 Red = No data, high interference
 -
- 4. Audio LED** - Green = Audio signal is present
- 5. Power LED** - Blue = Power On
- 6. Unbalanced Output** - Use a standard 1/4" cable to send audio output to an unbalanced mic level connection when an XLR balanced connection is unavailable.
- 7. Balanced Output** - (Preferred) Use a standard XLR cable to connect to a balanced XLR mic input.
- 8. Power Supply** - To turn on the receiver, plug the Line 6 DC-1g power supply into the receiver's 9V DC input jack.

THH06 MICROPHONE OPERATION



1. **Power Button** - Press briefly to turn on. Hold 2 seconds to turn off.
2. **Channel Select** - Set THH06 Microphone to the same channel as the RXT06 Receiver. Press briefly to select a Channel from 1 to 6.
3. **Channel LEDs** - Illuminates blue to show the current active channel THH06 is transmitting on. Channel 6 LED will illuminate red when battery life is low and blink red when very low (change batteries).


Battery Installation / Removal



THH06 uses two AA batteries. To install or remove batteries, remove the microphone base by turning it counter clockwise then open the battery door to access battery compartment. Observe correct polarity when installing.

NOTE: Do not over tighten microphone base.

Using the Lock feature




The **LOCK** switch is located behind the battery compartment indicated in the illustration above. The **LOCK** switch comes from the factory in the unlocked position. This allows you to make any necessary adjustments for your initial setup. After you made all of your adjustments it's advised that you set the **LOCK** switch to its locked position.

When unlocked the **LOCK** switch will be set to the Left position. In this mode you are able to power on and off or switch channels.

Once you've selected a channel and ready to use the microphone, slide the switch to the Right to it's locked position. This will prevent the front panel controls from being able to change channels or shut the microphone off accidentally.

To turn the microphone off when THH06 is in **LOCK** mode it's necessary to unscrew the microphone base and slide the **LOCK** switch to its unlocked position to the right. Once unlocked, press and hold the **POWER** button for 2 seconds.

TBP06 TRANSMITTER OPERATION



1. **Audio LED** - Green LED = Audio Signal
2. **Battery LED**
 - Blue LED = Full Charge
 - Solid Red LED = Low Charge
 - Flashing Red LED = Very Low Charge
3. **Power** - Slide switch to turn on/off transmitter.
4. **Channel Select** - Set TBP06 Microphone to the same channel as the RXT06 Receiver.

5. **Input** - Connect the 1/4" inch TRS plug from LM-44 here.

Attaching and positioning the mic: Use the mic clip to attach the lavalier mic to clothing taking care to point the microphone towards the intended sound source. Avoid fixing mic to where mechanical noise can be generated such as zippers, inside pockets, etc.

6. **Battery Installation** - Open the side door to access the battery compartment. The inside of the battery compartment door indicates the correct battery direction. For best results use only non-rechargeable alkaline batteries.
